## AUSTRALIAN KODÁLY CERTIFICATE COURSE 2024

### WELCOME!

Thank you for your interest in the Australian Kodály Certificate Course 2024.

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Kodály WA

The AKC is the only fully accredited and nationally recognised Australian program of teacher training in the Kodály approach to music education. The AKC was established some 30 years ago and during this time, over 200 teachers have successfully completed the requirements. The Course is normally completed over three years of part-time study.

The curriculum for the Certificate has been modelled on outstanding international Kodály programs and adapted to suit the needs of Australian educators. It is comprehensive and involves a mixture of both hands-on (practical) and lecture-style tuition. The course curriculum sets out at least 60 contact hours of study at each level across Musicianship, Pedagogy, Practicum, Cultural Materials, Choir and Conducting.

In 2024, Kodály Western Australia will deliver the AKC on Tuesday evenings over 22 weeks during the school year. This model allows participants to incorporate ideas more quickly into their teaching.

We encourage you to take advantage of this unique opportunity for professional development.

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### AKC COURSE OVERVIEW

AKC Course participants undertake a total of 60 hours of study across six modules: Musicianship, Pedagogy, Practicum, Cultural Materials, Ensemble (Choir) and Conducting.

#### **MUSICIANSHIP (15 HOURS)**

Enjoy singing and performing a range of musical works in a fun and supportive learning environment. Develop your sight-reading, sight-singing, aural perception, theory and part-work skills through active music-making using the tools of the Kodály approach (moveable tonic sol-fa, rhythmic syllables and Curwen hand signs). Participants are invited to choose the class that best suits their musical needs and experience. Everyone is welcome - from beginners to experienced musicians.

#### PEDAGOGY (15 HOURS)

Learn new songs, games, dances and musical works to engage your students. Study strategies of curriculum design, teaching, planning and assessment appropriate for delivery of a sequential and developmental music program. Knowledge and skills gained in this course will support teachers in meeting the requirements of the Australian curriculum. Participants will choose to specialise in one of three streams: Early Childhood, Primary or Secondary Music Education.

#### **PRACTICUM (5 HOURS)**

Engage in practical micro-teaching experiences of the skills and concepts studied in Pedagogy. Reflective practice is encouraged through a supportive peer-learning environment where participants take on the role of both teacher and student.

#### CULTURAL MATERIALS (5 HOURS)

Learn, collect and analyse the folk music of Australia and other nations to determine suitability for pedagogical processes outlined in pedagogy, and the use of this material in a developmental music program.

#### ENSEMBLE: CHOIR (10 HOURS)

The Course Choir is your opportunity to perform quality choral music. Experience rehearsal strategies and warm-ups that can be readily applied in your own teaching context.

#### CONDUCTING (10 HOURS)

Learn about rehearsal strategies, repertoire and conducting techniques through active music-making and conducting the class (vocal) ensemble. Taught by experienced conductors, participants will have the freedom to choose the class that best suits their teaching context and musical needs.

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#### Streams and Levels Offered

- Primary Level 1 with Jason Boron
- Secondary Level 1 with Dr Jason Goopy

Each level incorporates the study of Musicianship, Pedagogy, Practicum, Choir, Cultural Materials and Conducting.

Successful completion of Level 1 will allow participants to complete Level 2 and Level 3 in subsequent years to fulfil the requirements of the Australian Kodály Certificate.

#### **Jason Boron**

Jason Boron is an experienced music educator who has taught in early childhood, primary, secondary and tertiary contexts. Jason is currently Lecturer in Music Education (Early Childhood and Primary) and First Year Coordinator (BEd Primary) at Edith Cowan University. He has developed innovative programs, including a daily music program at Presbyterian Ladies' College for all students from pre-Kindergarten to Year 2 and has led AKC Courses in WA since their inception. Jason has lectured in Australian Kodály Certificate courses offered by Cuskelly College, Kodály SA and Kodály WA. He is currently National President of Kodály Australia and a past Chairperson of the Australian Society for Music Education WA Chapter. Jason is a past recipient of the Sarolta Kodály Scholarship from the International Kodály Society. In 2015, he graduated with a Master of Arts (Music Pedagogy) with highest honours from the Kodály Institute of the Liszt Academy of Music, Hungary. Jason maintains regular work with children as a choral conductor for the West Australian Young Voices (WAYV).

Jason will be presenting Primary 1 and Musicianship Levels 1-3.



#### Dr Jason Goopy

BMus (Hons) Qld, BEd Qld, GradCertUniTeach Melb, MMus (Aural Pedagogy) Qld, PhD Qld

Dr Jason Goopy is a recognised teacher, scholar, and leader in music education and a specialist in Kodály-inspired pedagogy. He is known for developing engaging programs that connect to real-world practices and nurture multiple musical identities. Jason is currently Lecturer and Coordinator of Secondary & Instrumental Music Education at Edith Cowan University and draws upon 15 years of teaching music in Queensland combined primary and secondary schools. He was previously Head of the Arts & Choral Coordinator at Ambrose Treacy College (4-12) and prior was a Highly Accomplished Teacher at Brisbane Boys' College (P-12) where he established a daily music program for all students from Prep to Year 3. Jason has lectured for Australian Kodály Certificate courses in Brisbane, Sydney, and Perth. He is the current President of the Australian Society for Music Education and Education Committee Convenor and Immediate Past President of Kodály Australia. In 2024, Jason joins the conducting team of Naya Chorale.

Jason will be presenting Secondary 1 and Musicianship Level 4.
